PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

Welcome back to the start of a new academic year. I hope you all had a very restful break. It was fantastic to see students return to school this week. I saw lots of very enthusiastic and smiling faces eager to reconnect with their peers and teachers. I look forward to a brilliant year ahead.

This year will be punctuated with a continued focus on building on and refining key work that commenced over the past two years, with a strong emphasis on improving literacy and numeracy outcomes across the school. We are also excited to see the roll out of School-wide positive behaviour support (SWPBS) at our school. A framework that brings together school communities to develop positive, safe, supportive learning cultures.

The focus has and always will be on the ongoing pursuit of excellence across all aspects of our daily practices. This includes ensuring that we maintain high standards in the maintenance of our physical environments including our buildings and grounds and classroom settings. Ensuring the delivery of the highest academic and wellbeing outcomes for every student, every day is paramount.

Every staff member, parent and student at the school has a role to play in the success of this work. It is impossible to run a high performing school without the support of great staff and the partnership of a fantastic school community. We are very fortunate to have both.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL UPDATE

Just like that and it is a new year! It was so great to see all our students' smiling faces on Monday. There was lots of excitement and of course a few nerves as well that were quickly settled. A very special welcome to our new students and their families who I'm confident will thoroughly enjoy their time at Ardeer Primary School. If you have any questions at all throughout the year, please don't hesitate to give me a call or drop in and see me.

Every day of learning is important and it's vital that your child maintains at high level of attendance at school. We recognise and reward our students who have high attendance though our termly HERO Awards. These awards recognise students who are Here Everyday and Ready On-time (HERO) for learning. Students who maintain an attendance rate of 97% or higher across the term will be recognised and participate in a special lunch at the commencement of the following term.

Each day commences with Independent Reading at 8.45am and teachers will be running reading conferences with students at this time and setting learning goals. The first four weeks of learning will have a strong emphasis on establishing learning routines with a focus on literacy and numeracy practices. If your child arrives at school after 8.45am, they will need to be signed in at the General Office and be given a pass to go to class.

Throughout the year, we will hold family information nights on literacy and numeracy to share our approaches to teaching and how you can support your child at home in these areas. This week we are holding our first numeracy night for the year. This will introduce our instructional model for Maths and share with families some resources that can help to reinforce their child's skills at home. We will be holding a follow up numeracy session in Term 2. I've included some strategies below that can be used to help build literacy skills at home as well:

1. Get your kids to write for a reason

It doesn't matter how small the task is. Encouraging children to write for a clear purpose is key. It can be a simple reminder note, a message to go in someone's lunch box, a shopping list or a birthday card.

2. Write together for fun

Encourage family activities that make writing fun. Create jokes, riddles, stories, rhyming lists, and anything else you can think of!

3. Display writing done in the family

Use the fridge, family noticeboard or calendar. This shows children how writing works in our lives and how important it is and how it is valued.





ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL UPDATE (CON'T)

4. Get your kids to read you their writing

Ask children to read their writing aloud. This shows your kids you are interested in what they are doing. Also, when children read their written work aloud, they will inevitably notice some mistakes (so it's like revising their work).

5. Be encouraging

When working on writing skills with your child, make sure you are positive. You could say things such as, "I noticed that you really focused on your writing" or "I really like how you used [that word]". Also recognise any progress in their writing efforts, "I noticed that you checked your capital letters".

6. Take the initiative at school

Talk to your child's teacher about what you are doing at home and ask for suggestions about what your child needs to further develop their writing skills.

Compass:

Compass is the main online platform for school-wide communication with families. This will include important information about upcoming events, excursions and other pertinent information. Parent log in information for families new to the school will be sent home with children on Thursday in week 1. If you if you have any access difficulties, please don't hesitate to contact me. If your child was at Ardeer Primary School in 2022 but you no longer have your Compass log in information. Please phone or visit me and I will print these off for you.

Breakfast Club:

Breakfast Club was introduced in Term 2 last year and will again be happening from Week 2 (Friday 10th February) this term! This will continue to be happening on a Friday morning under the COLA and will run from 8.15am – 8.40am. Toast, fruit cups and toasties will be available.

Wellbeing at Ardeer Primary School

If your child needs any additional wellbeing support at Ardeer Primary School, please don't hesitate to make contact with your child's classroom teacher, our principal or myself and we will organise support. We also have our school chaplain; Jo, on-site one day each week and she will continue to run small group sessions, visit classrooms and facilitate some lunchtime activities. If you would like to discuss the chaplaincy program, please contact me to discuss how Jo may be able to support your child. Please note that there is a consent form which needs to be completed before Jo can run any small group or individual sessions with your child. Please contact me for further details.




INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND

NEW OSHC PROVIDER- THEIRCARE

Our school has partnered with an independent provider called TheirCare to provide exceptional Outside School Hours Care services for our school community.

The program is available for all children at Ardeer Primary School from 6:30am until 8:30am in the morning and from 3:15pm until 6:30pm each school day.

During School Holidays & Pupil Free Days the service will operate from 6:30am until 6:30pm.

Families are eligible for a Government Rebate called the Child Care Subsidy which can reduce the cost per session by up to 85%.

TheirCare provides a stimulating and safe environment for all children. During sessions, children develop life-skills, friendships, confidence and creativity through play-based programs.

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school, in accordance with Ministerial Order 1280 Constitution of Government School Councils, and the Education and Training Reform Act 2006. In doing this, a school council may directly influence the quality of education for students.

Who is on the school council?

For most primary school councils, there are several possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected parent member category – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category.

Department employees can be parent members at their child's school providing that they are not engaged in work at the school.

A mandated elected school employee member category – members of this category make up no more than one-third of membership. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

An optional community member category – members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experience. Department employees are not eligible to be community members.

A small number of school councils have nominee members.

For all schools with a Year 7 and above cohort, there is an additional category of membership:

A mandated elected student member category, two positions.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills and a range of experiences and knowledge that can help inform and shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

Do I need special experience to be on school council?

Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role, however, in order to successfully perform their duties, councillors may need to gain some new skills and knowledge.

It is important to have an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

Code of conduct for school councillors

School councils in Victoria are public entities as defined by the Public Administration Act 2004.

School councillors must comply with the Code of Conduct for Directors of Victorian Public Entities issued by the Victorian Public Sector Commission. The Code of Conduct is based on the Victorian public sector values and requires councillors to:

act with honesty and integrity – be truthful, open and clear about their motives and declare any real, potential or perceived conflict of interest and duty

act in good faith in the best interests of the school – work cooperatively with other councillors and the school community, be reasonable, and make all decisions with the best interests of students foremost in their minds

act fairly and impartially – consider all relevant facts of an issue before making a decision, seek to have a balanced view, never give special treatment to a person or group and never act from self-interest

use information appropriately – respect confidentiality and use information for the purpose for which it was made available

exercise due care, diligence and skill – accept responsibility for decisions and do what is best for the school use the position appropriately – not use the position as a councillor to gain an advantage act in a financially responsible manner – observe all the above principles when making financial decisions

comply with relevant legislation and policies – know what legislation and policies are relevant for which decisions and obey the law

demonstrate leadership and stewardship – set a good example, encourage a culture of accountability, manage risks effectively, exercise care and responsibility to keep the school strong and sustainable.

Indemnity for school council members

School councillors are indemnified against any liability in respect of any loss or damage suffered by the council or any other person in respect of anything necessarily or reasonably done, or omitted to be done by the councillor in good faith in:

a. the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a councillor, or

the reasonable belief that the act or omission was in the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a council.

In other words, school councillors are not legally liable for any loss or damage suffered by council or others as a result of reasonable actions taken in good faith.

How can you become involved?

By participating in, and voting in the school council elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might consider:

standing for election as a member of the school council encouraging another person to stand for election.





What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for nominations in Term 1 of each year. Council elections must be completed by 31 March, unless varied by the Minister for Education.

If you stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or, you can nominate yourself in the parent member category. You can only be nominated by another member of the same electorate that you are eligible for (e.g. a member of the parent electorate may only nominate another parent of that electorate)

Department employees with a child enrolled at a school where they are not engaged in work, are eligible to nominate for parent membership at that school.

Return your completed nomination form to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt via post, email or by hand delivery.

Generally, if there are more nominations than vacancies a ballot will be conducted in the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

Consider standing for election to school council.

Ask the principal for instructions if you are not sure what to do.

Be sure to vote if the election goes to ballot.

Contact the principal if you are unsure about what is required at any stage of the election process.

a) Notice of election and call for nominations	Friday 3 rd February 2023
b) Closing date for nominations	Friday 10 th February 2023
At the end of the nomination period, if the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies in any one membership category, declare those who nominated as being elected and publicise an extension of three school days. Call for nominations for the remaining vacancies	
Where the nominations exceed the number of vacancies and a ballot is required, inform the community and the candidates. Provide candidates with the opportunity to prepare a written statement. Provide clear instructions about the preparation of the statement and check that instructions have been followed before sending out statements with the ballot papers	
c) Date by which the list of candidates and nominators will be posted (If an election is required)	Monday 13 th February 2023
d) Date by which ballot papers will be prepared and distributed- (If an election is required)	On or before Monday 27 th February 2023
e) Close of ballot - (If an election is required)	Friday 3 rd March 2023
f) Vote count: (If an election is required)	Friday 3 rd March 2023
g) Declaration of poll: (If an election is required)	Monday 6th March 2023
h) Special council meeting to co-opt community members (the principal will preside)	Monday 20 th March 2023
i) First council meeting to elect office bearers (the principal will preside)	Monday 20 th March 2023


