As we venture further into the semester, the latest highlights from our students' educational journey is being able to sign various different birds from peacocks, flamingos, toucans, parrots, eagles, emus, penguins and our Australian natives, kookaburras.

I would like to share a valuable insight from a professional development opportunity that has a significant impact on our children's language development. During this session, I gained a deeper understanding of the crucial role finger-spelling plays in enhancing spelling proficiency and overall language skills. The act of physically forming letters with their fingers reinforces the connection between letters and their corresponding sounds, facilitating a stronger grasp of spelling rules and patterns. The more our students practice finger-spelling, the more confident and proficient spellers they can become. With this in mind, I highly encourage you to actively support and motivate your child/ren to engage in regular finger-spelling practice at home. Encouraging them to use finger-spelling while reading various books will further reinforce their spelling skills and boost their overall language comprehension.

Our students also had the opportunity to watch "Feathers for Phoebe" in Auslan. This storybook experience not only entertained but also deepened their understanding of sign language and its expressive power.

Prep and Year One students have been rehearsing diligently, practicing sign language while preparing for an assembly. They will delight everyone with heart-warming renditions of "Five Little Ducks" and "I Can Sing a Rainbow." Through these songs, our young performers explore the beauty of nature while incorporating valuable elements of literacy and numeracy into their learning.



CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

Why do we need Child Safe Standards?

All organisations working with children must take steps to prevent child abuse. They cannot assume that child abuse does not, and cannot, happen within their organisation.

The standards are a result of recommendations of the Victorian Parliament's Betrayal of Trust inquiry and evidence of what works to prevent child abuse.

In 2012 and 2013 the Victorian Parliamentary Inquiry looked into the handling of child abuse by religious and non-government organisations. Its report highlighted poor and inconsistent practices for keeping children safe. It found some organisations' cultures did not focus on children's safety and many failed to report or act on child abuse allegations.

In 2019, the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse proposed Child Safe Standards to make institutions safer for children with regulatory oversight to ensure implementation by institutions.

In 2021, the Victorian Government announced changes to make the Child Safe Standards even stronger.

What the Standards aim to achieve

The Child Safe Standards aim to:

promote the safety of children

prevent child abuse

ensure organisations and businesses have effective processes in place to respond to and report all allegations of child abuse.

Child Safe Standards work by:

driving changes in organisational culture – embedding child safety in everyday thinking and practice providing a minimum standard of child safety across all organisations highlighting that we all have a role to keep children safe from abuse.






