Reading Strategies Focuses Visualising Summarising Inferring character traits and feelings Inferring theme and message	Exploring the World of Informative Texts Study a selection of informative texts on a variety of topics - animals, space, science, dinosaurs, technology etc Identify the text features of informative texts - eg Table of Contents, index, glossary, tables, title, diagrams, illustrations etc Experiment by writing informative texts	Clarifying ask specific questions to clarify a speakers meaning make constructive comments to keep conversations moving to be able to reword your own thinking to convey your message to a range of audiences	Plurals Common plurals such as; adding s, adding es, and changing y to i before adding es to words that end in consonant plus y. Irregular plurals such as; tooth/teeth, man/men.
