MASK WEARING

Please find below correspondence that was sent out via Compass regarding the strong recommendation for mask wearing for staff and students aged 8 and over throughout the winter season.

I am writing to you further to the recent announcements by the Victorian government about public health measures to help reduce the spread of COVID-19 and other illnesses, especially influenza, throughout the remainder of the winter season.

Schools received communication last night from the Department of Education outlining recommendations regarding mask wearing in schools throughout the winter season.

It is strongly recommended by the Victorian Department of Health that face masks are worn in indoor settings, with face masks **mandatory for those aged 8 and over who are household contacts and attending school**. This is because the wearing of masks is effective in reducing the transmission of COVID-19.

What does this mean in practice for schools?

It is the department's expectation that, through to the end of winter, students aged 8 and over and staff will wear masks when in class, except where removing a mask is necessary for clear communication or when a particular activity requires the removal of a mask.

Masks are not required to be worn outdoors but can be worn when physical distancing is not possible. This expectation should not constrain student participation in the full range of school activities, including music, sport and performances.

Should there be any reason why your child cannot wear a mask, we please ask that you communicate this via email to ardeer.ps@education.vic.gov.au, so as to ensure all circumstances are respected and clear for all concerned.

We extend our gratitude for your support and understanding.




NAIDOC WEEK

SEAL Program – Year 7

Select Entry Accelerated Learning Program (SEALP) Parent Information

In 2023 Victoria University Secondary College will be offering the accredited SEAL program to Year 7 students.

The Academy of Accredited SEAL Schools (TAASS) accredits schools who run the SEAL program. The SEAL program is designed to enrich and extend students through a curriculum that emphasises content of greater complexity and depth, more abstract and challenging learning tasks, higher order critical and creative thinking, problem-solving skills, independent research skills and leadership opportunities. This supportive environment encourages learning and collaboration with like-minded peers to develop students academically, socially and emotionally.

Features of Accelerated Learning

- Differentiation based on student skills, aptitude and interest
- · Elimination of repetition and the practice of already mastered skills
- Accelerated pace of learning
- · Development of metacognitive and higher order thinking skills
- Opportunities for deep learning and inquiry-based learning through to Year 10.

Benefits of Accelerated Learning

- Students feel challenged by curriculum that is sufficiently advanced and delivered at a pace that
 maintains student interest
- Students are given an opportunity to complete a range of subjects with greater depth and breadth
- The curriculum caters for the abilities of students and provides opportunities for abstract thinking
- Increased opportunity to study VCE subjects in Year 10 and greater flexibility in their choice of subjects in the remaining years of secondary school.

Who Should Apply?

If your child is highly motivated, retains knowledge well and is often bored in mainstream classes, this may indicate that they need to be extended. The SEAL Program is for students who desire to extend themselves and move ahead.

Selection Process

To be selected into this program students must achieve a high standard on the formal SEAL examination. A non-refundable fee of \$88 will be payable upon registration. Testing will take place at the VUSC Junior Campus on Monday 1 August 2022.
