Dear Families,

As we approach the halfway mark of the final term of the year, the staff and leadership team are busy working on developing our strategic direction for the next twelve months. This will see the development of our 2023 Annual Implementation Plan. Although we have processes in place throughout the course of the year to monitor and reflect on the effectiveness of our ongoing work, it is always an exciting time of the year where we dig that bit deeper to acknowledge our collective efforts and seek opportunities to continue to drive school improvement.

As part of this process, staff will work together to unpack a range of data that we have collected over the course of the year. This includes student Attitudes to School survey data, Parent Opinion and Staff Opinion survey data. It will also include the analysis of a range of achievement and wellbeing data including NAPLAN results. Also shaping this work will be our overarching four-year School Strategic Plan that was developed in 2021 as part of our school review process.

As part of this process, it has been so pleasing to read the positive results of our 2022 Parent Opinion survey. The results are consistent with the feedback that we receive about our wonderful school and highlights the high importance that we place in the development of strong parent and school partnerships.
