#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

I hope you and your family are keeping well. It is very hard to believe that we are almost approaching the mid-way point of the school year. As is the case each year, staff will soon commence the process of completing Semester 1 reports. - -able share their successes and challenges at school


Anna Zobel is an author and has various titles published such as; 'Little Gem', 'Who's Your Real Mum?


And 'Little Gem and the Mysterious Letters.'





# Miss H's Maths Tips

## RECIPES

- 170. Collect and read recipes and discuss the use of fractions, millimetres and grams. Encourage your child to make accurate measurements using measuring cups and spoons.
- 171. Discuss how you would double a recipe. Encourage your child to record the new measurements for the recipe.
- 172. Identify the temperature and cooking time on the recipe.
- 173. Estimate the cost to buy all the ingredients to make the recipe.
- Make a list of the abbreviations used in the recipe and then write them in full, for example, L for litre, mL for millilitre, tsp for teaspoon, tbs for tablespoon.

## **MEASURING** things

- 68. Use a wall measuring chart to measure the height of people in your family.
- 69. Cut a piece of string for your child, any length will do. Use the string to measure the objects in your house to find out what is longer or shorter than your 'string measuring tape'. Ask your child to identify anything that is the same length.
- 70. Explore other ways of measuring using a cup, jug, teaspoon, icy pole sticks, foot prints or hand lengths.
- 71. Build a tower of blocks that is taller than a favourite toy. Ask your child to count the total blocks to measure the height of the tower.

## Other People Looking After Your Child - Babysitters

Leaving your child in the care of another person requires careful consideration. Victorian law does not say how old a babysitter must be; you must think about the maturity of the person and if they have the skills to keep your child safe and well – check they have experience in looking after a child of similar age to yours – this is particularly important for babies.

- Talk to other people you know and trust and ask who they have used as a babysitter.
- Ask a potential babysitter for references for you to contact to help you decide if the person is a good fit for you and your children.
- Have a conversation with the babysitter about your expectations - be clear they must never leave a child unattended; explain bath safety; safe sleeping requirements for a baby or young child, and the importance of never shaking a baby.
- Be clear with the babysitter that you expect positive interaction with your child – it is not OK for a babysitter to yell, hit, abuse, ignore, shame or demean your child.
- Provide your family rules and routines for meal time and bedtimes.
- Make sure you give the babysitter information to help them care for your child safely and clarify any safety issues, including if the babysitter can have a friend over while they are caring for your child and who can and cannot visit the home whilst you are away.
- Prepare your child for a new babysitter talk to your child about the babysitter and observe their reaction to babysitter or other carer; this may provide insight into how comfortable they feel in the person's care – check with other people who have used the babysitter to ensure that they were happy with them.
- Make sure the babysitter knows what to do in an emergency – have the 000 emergency number clearly displayed, as well as the poisons information 13 11 26.
- Show the babysitter where you keep your first aid kit, fire extinguisher and fire blankets.




