Student Led Interviews – July 19th - 1pm – 6:30pm

Dear Families.

Last year we implemented Student Led Interviews, and the feedback was extremely positive. This shift was aimed at enhancing greater opportunities for student voice and agency. The skills that students develop in readiness for these interviews are extremely valuable. This work aligns with our aim of ensuring happy and confident learners that are:

- -active participants in their learning
- -able to articulate their strengths and areas for improvement
- -able to reflect deeply on what and how they best learn
- -able share their successes and challenges at school

As these will be Student Led Interviews, students must attend the interviews with their parents/guardians. Students will be leading these learning conversations with the support of their teacher.

The Student Led Interviews are strictly 10 minutes and will be held in your child's classroom. If you need more time with a particular teacher, arrange a separate meeting or phone call. You can also ask for a conference at other times. If you're concerned about your child's progress, contact the school to make an appointment.

- 5. Can you tell me what your goals are for reading, writing and maths? How do you think you are going with these goals?
- 6. What areas of your learning would you like to improve? Why?



CHILD SAFE STANDARDS- TEACHING YOUR CHILD HOW TO KEEP THEMSELVES SAFE

Tip Sheet: Child Safety

Teach your child how to keep themselves safe

As your child gets older, they become increasingly independent and may spend time away from you or with a babysitter/carer. As part of the journey of growing up, it's important to speak to your child about being safe. Let them know:

Tip 1

It's OK to say NO if they think what they're being asked to do is or feels wrong.

Tip 2

If they feel they're in danger, it's OK to yell, scream, kick or run to a safe place that you and your child have both agreed on – such as a neighbour or friend.

Tip 3

Make sure that you tell your child that you would never send a stranger to pick them up.

Tip 4

They can tell a lie, even to an adult, if they need to get away from someone who makes them feel unsafe.

Tip 5

To use a 'code' word you both have agreed on, to let you know they're not feeling safe; as an example, using your first name when talking to you on the phone.

Tip 6

Their body is their own – once a child no longer needs nappies to be changed or help with toileting, a carer or any other person should not touch their private areas.

Tip 7

To tell you or another adult if they have any problems or if someone is making them feel unsafe.

Tip 8

A babysitter or any other adult should not ask a child to keep a secret.

Tip 9

Not to give out personal information online, including their school, suburb, sporting team or nicknames and to never meet someone they have met online in person.



TURNING maths into a story

By presenting mathematics as a story children can make links to their everyday life. Begin by reading books to your child that include numbers and counting.



Turn everyday events or objects into a maths story:

- 76. Count the fruit in the fruit bowl.
- 77. Cut fruit into six pieces.
- 78. Count the pieces of toast you cooked at breakfast.
- 79. Add the total of cutlery at the table.
- 80. Count the number of people travelling in the car or the bus.

Encourage your child to draw and talk about the number of things in the pictures they have drawn. Write down your child's ideas as a story. Here are some examples:

- 81. There are five pieces of fruit in our bowl. Three are apples and two are bananas.
- 82. My lunchbox has four things inside. One sandwich, one orange and two slices of cheese.

- 175. How would you spend \$40 from a catalogue? How many products can you buy for \$40?
- 176. Select five products from the catalogue then calculate what the cost be if there was a 50% sale. Does it make a difference if you add up the items, and then deduct 50%, or if each item is reduced by 50% then totalled?
- 177. What is the best value sale item in the catalogue? Can you explain your reasoning?
- 178. What are the cheapest and most expensive items in your catalogue?
- 179. Compare the cost of a product across different stores using different catalogues. What did you find?




