Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF)





The Victorian Government has again committed to providing eligible students with Camps, Sports & Excursion funds (CSEF). These funds are paid to the school to use towards excursions, incursions, and camps for eligible students. To be eligible for the funding, a parent or legal guardian must be the holder of a current Healthcare card or Pension card or be a temporary foster parent on the first day of Term 1 or Term 2. Parents who are eligible for CSEF and are applying for CSEF for the first time at the school or have a child commencing in 2024 will be required to complete a CSEF application form as early as possible in the New Year. Applications close at the end of Term 2, 2024.

Centrepay

Centrepay is a free service offered by Centrelink to help recipients of Centrelink payments arrange regular deductions for payment of ongoing expenses and regular bills. Should you wish to participate in this, please speak with a member of the administration team in the Office.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the contributions for school deems necessary for non-curriculum items and students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.

CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

Older children home alone

There is no specific law in Victoria that says what age children can be left alone. Victorian law is clear however, that it is a parent's responsibility to ensure that their children are appropriately and safely cared for.

When deciding if your child is old or mature enough to stay home alone, it's useful to consider the following questions:

Tip 1

Do they feel comfortable and confident about being left alone?

Tip 2

Can they use the telephone?

Tip 3

Do they know how to keep themselves safe? For example, do they know not to answer the door or not to swim in the pool?

Tip 4

Are they mature enough to handle any problems that might arise like a fire or injury?

Tip 5

Do they have any illnesses, such as asthma, that may make it unsafe for them to be alone?

Tip 6

Do they know appropriate adults in your local area who they can contact for help?

Tip 7

Do they know how to access emergency services by ringing 000?

Tip 8

How long will you be away? There is a big difference between you going to the shop for a few minutes and being gone for several hours.

Tip 9

Who else is in the house?





Recently, students from Year 4, 5 and 6 had the valuable opportunity to partake in a school excursion that combined a visit to a Deaf café with a historical tour of the original Deaf school's construction. The fascinating history behind this institution stems from the life of Mr. Fredrick John Rose, who was profoundly deaf and from England.

Mr. Rose's Journey brought him to Melbourne during the Gold Rush era, where he subsequently trekked to Bendigo in pursuit of fortune, like many others at the time. Despite being a carpenter by trade, his quest for gold proved elusive, prompting a change in his path.

During this transformative period, he chanced upon an article that caught his attention: a heartfelt plea from a mother seeking support to establish a Deaf school. Responding to this plea, Mr. Rose met with the concerned mother, and together, they deliberated on the concept of setting up the first Deaf school.

Today, this historic institution is renowned as the 'Blue Stone Building'. During our excursion, students had the privilege of visiting this iconic site, allowing them to gain a deeper understanding of the educational experiences that unfolded within its walls. It was a journey into history that provided students with a unique perspective on the educational landscape of the past.

Our excursion was to go to the deaf café and deaf school. The day started with getting on the bus and sitting down next to William at the back, we chatted and played on MS H's iPad until we got there but this part isn't important.

We got off the bus and walked over to the deaf café and was warmly greeted by a café employee who was very kind to us. We sat outside for a while practicing signing our name, 2 employees helped us sign our names (they were also deaf). Finally, after waiting 5 minutes we sat down at tables and was called up to sign our names (we didn't get to sign our order instead we greeted them and said our name although some people asked to sign their order but I didn't know that). I ordered a sausage roll, brownie and a chocolate Big M, quickly after we were given our ordered and we proceeded to eat it although we had less time to eat due to us waiting outside before being seated so we had extra time, about 10 minutes. After we ate we headed outside to be greeted by a man who was going to be our tour guide inside the deaf school.

We headed inside the school and we learnt about FJ rose who was the original owner at the school, we also learnt that a deaf mother complained to the newspaper about her deaf daughter and how she could not receive education due to her being deaf, FJ rose saw this and decided to make the first deaf school in Melbourne but before he could make the school he had to marry someone (I forgot the rest but I know that FJ rose got kicked out by hearing people at the school and that he spent all of his fortune from being a carpenter into the school). We headed down the hall way and was led into the basement which we learnt about the boy's bath room (they only had 1 bath a week). Before learning about the boys bath we learnt about the well which had to get water, heat it up then put it in the bath and they had to do this a lot of times. We then went past the bath and we learnt that they learnt either woodwork or something else I forgot. Afterwards we went upstairs (there was a ton of stairs) where we were split into 2 groups, one went upstairs to the tower and learnt about it and the other group (I went into the room near first) went to the room near and we learnt about lots of things, tools, diaries and lots of photos. Afterwards we switched places and I went upstairs to reach the tower. The tower didn't have any major purpose other than to be built to be the tallest building in Melbourne for a year or so.

After all that we descended the building and went outside to take some photos

Overall, the experience was amazing and I think I really liked it.




