The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. Last year we used the survey results to plan a range of initiatives including ways to support improved parent and school partnerships.



School Wide Positive Behaviour Support

Our weekly SWPBS 'Gotchas' were very successful at reinforcing our students' positive behaviour last term and will be continued in Term 3.

During weeks 3 and 4, our focus has been on:

Moving quietly through shared indoor spaces

Using kind words

It's been great to see so many students showing respect for others by walking quietly and calmly and quietly in the corridors, classrooms, and other shared areas. Keeping noise down helps everyone concentrate and feel calm – and it shows great self-awareness and care for our school environment!

Students have also been encouraged to use kind, encouraging words with their peers and teachers. Whether it's saying hello, a helpful comment, using their manners or a thoughtful compliment – these small moments of kindness make a big difference in building a supportive, inclusive community.

Let's keep making our school a great place to learn, grow, and be kind.

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING AT HOME



Board Games and Maths at home.

Math learning doesn't have to be all about worksheets—it can be playful, exciting, and part of family bonding time! Games are a fantastic way to build children's confidence in math while encouraging problem-solving, critical thinking, and number sense. Here are some fun and easy-to-play games, including board games, card games, and homemade activities that promote math for children aged 5 to 12.

Math Bingo Skills: Number recognition, addition, subtraction, multiplication Create bingo cards with answers to math questions (e.g., 7, 12, 24). Call out the questions instead of the answers, like "What is 6 + 6?" or "What is 3 x 8?" Players solve the problem to find the right square. Customize difficulty based on age.

Dice Wars Skills: Addition, subtraction, multiplication

Each player rolls two or three dice and performs an operation (add, subtract, or multiply). The player with the highest total wins the round. Great for mental math practice and quick calculations.

<u>Monopoly Junior or Monopoly</u> Skills: Counting money, budgeting, strategic thinking Monopoly (and its Junior version) are great for helping kids practice counting money, giving change, and making decisions. Encourage children to be the banker for extra math practice.

<u>Uno (with a Math Twist)</u> Skills: Number recognition, strategy, sequencing Play classic Uno, but add a math challenge on each turn: before playing a card, the player must solve a math fact (e.g., "What's 6 x 7?"). For younger kids, stick to addition or counting questions.

<u>Math War (Card Game)</u> Skills: Number comparison, mental math
Using a standard deck of cards (remove face cards), each player flips two cards and adds or multiplies them.
The player with the higher total wins the round. For younger kids, use one card per player for number comparison.

Estimation Jar Skills: Estimation, counting, place value

Fill a jar with small items (beans, buttons, LEGO bricks) and have everyone guess how many are inside. Then count together and talk about strategies for making better estimates. You can change the items weekly for variety.

Shopping Game Skills: Money math, addition, subtraction

Set up a pretend store using toys, snacks, or school supplies with labeled prices. Give kids a budget and let them shop while keeping track of their spending. Older kids can calculate discounts or tax to make it more challenging.

Pattern Block Puzzles or Tangrams Skills: Geometry, spatial awareness, symmetry

Use pattern blocks or tangram sets to build shapes and complete puzzles. These games help children understand shape properties and spatial relationships, which are key parts of geometry.

Guess My Number Skills: Logical thinking, number sense

Think of a number between 1 and 100. Players take turns asking yes/no questions: "Is it greater than 50?" "Is it an even number?" Keep going until someone guesses correctly. This helps develop reasoning and strategy.

Board Games that Build Math Skills

- Sum Swamp (ages 5–8): A fun board game focused on basic addition and subtraction.
- Prime Climb (ages 10+): A colorful, strategic game that builds multiplication and division fluency.
- Qwirkle: Great for pattern recognition and logical thinking.
- Rummikub: Reinforces number sequencing and strategy skills.


Math Scavenger Hunt Skills: Measurement, time, counting

Create a scavenger hunt with math clues like: "Find something that is 10 inches long," "Find 5 things that are the same shape," or "Add up the numbers on two clocks in the house." Kids stay active while practicing math skills.

<u>Time Trials</u> Skills: Time, speed, mental math

Set a timer and challenge kids to complete a set of math problems or solve a puzzle as quickly as they can. Repeat the activity another day and try to beat the previous score for a fun and motivating challenge.

These games are not only fun, but they also create opportunities for children to engage with math in a relaxed and encouraging environment. Whether you're using cards, dice, store-bought games, or everyday household items, playing math games as a family helps children see math as something enjoyable and useful—building skills they'll use for life.
