The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. Last year we used the survey results to plan a range of initiatives including ways to support improved parent and school partnerships.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support

At Ardeer Primary School, we are always celebrating the ways our students show positive behaviour. Here are our 'Gotchas' from week 5 and 6:

Encourage Each Other – Students have been demonstrating how to support their peers and help build a positive classroom culture. Whether it's a simple thumbs up or saying, 'Try your best!' when someone is feeling stuck, we're teaching students that words of encouragement can make the school feel like a safe and supportive place to learn.

Wait Patiently for Our Turn – Learning to be patient is a lifelong skill that helps students understand how to be respectful and responsible in different situations throughout their lives. We're practising taking turns during games, class discussions, and while lining up—showing respect and fairness to everyone.

Staff will be on the lookout for students demonstrating the 'Gotchas' each week. Feel free to chat at home about what this looks like, and maybe even spot some 'Gotcha moments' outside of school too!

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING AT HOME

Encouraging a Maths Growth Mindset

A growth mindset is the belief that abilities can be developed through effort, good strategies, and persistence. In maths, this mindset is especially powerful—children who see challenges as opportunities tend to become more confident and resilient learners.

How you can help at home:

Model positive language

Instead of: "I was never good at maths."

Try: "Maths can be tricky, but I know I can improve when I practise."

Children pick up on the attitudes they hear!

Celebrate mistakes

Mistakes aren't failures—they're signs your child is stretching their thinking. When your child makes an error, ask:

"What did you learn from this?" or "Can we try another strategy?"

Praise effort and strategies

Swap "You're so smart" with "I like how you kept trying different ways to solve that problem."

This helps children value persistence over quick answers.


Encourage the word "yet"

If your child says: "I can't do fractions," remind them to add "yet." It reframes the challenge as temporary and achievable.

Make challenges normal

Let your child struggle a little. If the problem feels tough, remind them: "This means your brain is growing.

By building a growth mindset, you're not just helping your child with maths—you're giving them skills for life: resilience, confidence, and a love of learning.



Helping Your Child with Writing at Home

Writing is a powerful way for children to express ideas, share stories, and build critical thinking skills. The Victorian Curriculum 2.0 encourages students to write for different purposes, use clear sentence structures, expand their vocabulary, and develop confidence in editing and refining their work.

Here are some simple ways you can support your child's writing journey at home:

1. Read Together Often

Reading helps build vocabulary and an understanding of different writing styles. Try reading a mix of fiction and non-fiction and talk about what you notice — how does the author start the story? What kind of language do they use?

2. Encourage Writing for Real Purposes

Writing doesn't have to be just for school! Encourage your child to:

- Write a shopping list
- Send a thank-you card
 - Keep a daily journal
- Write a short story or comic strip

3. Talk Before They Write

Talking helps children organise their thoughts. Before writing, ask questions like:

- "What do you want your reader to know?"
 - "How will you start your story?"
 - "What are the most important parts?"

4. Support Editing and Spelling Gently

The curriculum encourages students to review and improve their work. Help your child by:

- Praising their ideas first
- Asking if anything sounds unclear or could be improved
 - Using a dictionary or spellchecker together


5. Focus on Progress, Not Perfection

Children develop writing skills at different rates. Celebrate the effort they put into writing and encourage them to take risks and try new words or ideas.
