## SCHOOL COUNCIL REQUIREMENTS- WORKING WITH CHILDREN'S CHECK

From 2026, parents, carers and community members who would like to join the school council need a working with children (WWC) clearance to nominate. If you are considering nominating for school council, and don't already have a WWCC, I encourage you to apply for a volunteer WWC check as soon as possible. This will allow for processing times, which are estimated to be from 3 to 12 weeks.

Please note that if you do not hold a WWC clearance, you will not be able to nominate for school council, so it is vital that you prepare in advance. Obtaining a WWC clearance is free for volunteers, and you can apply online at [Service Victoria](#).

When applying for your volunteer WWC check, please nominate the Department of Education as the organisation you are working for.

If you already hold an employee WWC clearance, you do not need to obtain a volunteer WWC clearance to nominate for school council.

Victorian Institute of Teaching-registered teachers and school students who are interested in joining school council are not required to obtain a WWC clearance.



Current parents and community members of school council do not need to apply for a WWC check immediately. Current members only need a WWC clearance if their term ends and they wish to nominate or be co-opted again.

## **Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF)**

The Victorian Government has again committed to providing eligible students with Camps, Sports & Excursion funds (CSEF). These funds are paid to the school to use towards excursions, incursions, and camps for eligible students. To be eligible for the funding, a parent or legal guardian must be the holder of a current Healthcare card or Pension card or be a temporary foster parent on the first day of Term 1 or Term 2. Parents who are eligible for CSEF and are applying for CSEF for the first time at the school or have a child commencing in 2026 will be required to complete a CSEF application form as early as possible in the New Year. Applications close at the end of Term 2, 2026.

### **Centrepay**

Centrepay is a free service offered by Centrelink to help recipients of Centrelink payments arrange regular deductions for payment of ongoing expenses and regular bills. Should you wish to participate in this, please speak with a member of the administration team in the Office.

The Office will be open on **Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> January 2026 between 9:00am - 3:00pm** to assist parents in making payments prior to the commencement of the school year.

## FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



## PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



## FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.

## SCHOOL PROCESSES



# UNDERSTANDING THE VICTORIAN TEACHING AND LEARNING MODEL (VTLM 2.0)

## SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING AT HOME- (NUMERACY)

### Key Aspects of VTLM 2.0:

Evidence-Informed: Built on research in cognitive science, neuroscience, and effective practices from Victorian schools.

Focus on How Students Learn: Clearer emphasis on memory, retention, and making learning stick.

### Core Components:

How Students Learn: Understanding cognitive processes for effective learning.

How Teachers Teach: High-quality, evidence-based practices.

### Key Practices:

Explicit Teaching: Clear objectives, modeling, chunking information, scaffolding, feedback.

Positive Classroom Management: Strategies to create safe, inclusive environments.

### What it Means for Students:

Clearer learning goals.

Information presented in manageable steps.

More practice and support to build confidence.

More opportunities for independent application and critical thinking.

### Elements of Learning

The four elements of learning in the VTLM 2.0 are based on insights into the process of learning from cognitive science, neuroscience and education psychology.

The four elements of learning in the VTLM 2.0 represent these key findings from the evidence-base:

Attention, focus and regulation: Learning requires students' active engagement and focused attention in order to move new information from working memory to long-term memory. Student learning can be supported by minimising distractions, setting appropriate levels of challenge, using rules and routines, and establishing learning environments where students feel accepted, valued and that they belong.

## SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING AT HOME- (NUMERACY)

Knowledge and memory: Working memory is the active workspace for engaging with knowledge, skills and concepts. Learning happens when new knowledge moves from working memory to long-term memory. Long-term memory is where information, including our memories, are stored and new knowledge is linked to existing mental models.

Retention and recall: As working memory has limited capacity, it is best supported if new information is introduced in small, manageable chunks, a task is not too difficult for the current level of knowledge, there are no visual or auditory distractions and there are clear expectations and consistent rules and routines. Practice using new information facilitates transfer to long-term memory and retention. Recalling new knowledge strengthens the connections in long-term memory and makes it easier to apply.

Mastery and application: Spaced, varied and repeated practice consolidates learning, builds neural connections, supports transfer of learning to new situations and leads to ever more complex mental models in long-term memory. This in turn supports retrieval and application of knowledge. Students can more effectively engage in problem solving and generate new learning once they have acquired the relevant knowledge.


